Using an alike object of artist **Tony Feher**'s many sculptures, I created a mixed media piece of my own called "**Hold It In**". Incorporating pages from my childhood journals and books, acrylic paint, and 6 mason jars to crowd them in, I've made a brief illusion of how I have dealt with self expression. Being afraid to bring my own ideas into conversation, "Hold It In" demonstrates my history of repression towards speaking up.

"Loosen Up" is an 8 by 8 inch illustration piece produced on hot press board with black ink markers and watercolor paint. This piece is my interpretation of a silhouette drawing that, by taking a horror approach like Japanese horror artist **Junji Ito**, tells the story of an overworked painter who finds herself at a stand still when her painting arm twists into a spiral. Her arm seems to be fighting against her need to work, as it disables her from the passion she's grown so heavily attached to.

Medium: Ink Illustration on Bristol Paper

Exhibition Text:

Using inspiration from **Norman Rockwell's** sketches and **Keane's** song 'Disconnected', my piece "**Disconnected**" explores the distance between individuals, people who grew up together yet split apart, even as they're in the same room. With personal characters of mine from my story called "Exit 7", this piece is a black inked illustration, and by putting all the characters in frame, yet non-communicative with one another, it shows the disconnect we have from the people we grow up with through change.

Title: Growing Pains **Size:** 14.5 x 6in

Medium: Illustration w/ Watercolor Paints & Marker

Exhibition Text:

Resurfacing qualities of our childhood self and seeing how, even as we've grown, that we still carry them with us, "Growing Pains" is a two-part watercolor illustration inspired by Instagram artist Crap Panther's style of illustrating and Norman Rockwell's replication of human emotions and moments through pose and choice of motion.

The piece explores this idea through a character of mine, Melanie Baker, and demonstrates her instilled link to an alike clumsiness that her childhood self had.

"Unexcused Absence," getting inspiration from actual missing persons posters and the photography expertise of both Jeff Wall and Francesca Woodman, explores the idea of personal alteration. My piece contains a spread of around 30 prints, created using ink on linoleum board, and it's supposed to capture my supposed individual disappearance in that particular look, haircut and style. By putting myself in front, it exemplifies me not genuinely being missing but more so who I used to be.

Exploring an original character of mine, my art series **"Freaking Out"** explores the inwardly calm, yet outwardly panicked emotions of Dorian Smith. My piece was created using Posca paint markers and black acrylic paint on canvas, and it's inspired by artists **Holly Warburton** and **Hope Gangloff**, and their use of line variation (thick and thin) throughout their works.
